




News for 2021

- Apply before a PhD degree
- New grant sum 1 150 000 SEK / year,
 additional 50 000 SEK / year for accompaning family
- The grant has been delegated to our Scientific councils
- The grant should also "promote the quality and renewal of Swedish research."

Aim International Postdoc

The purpose of the grant is to give newly qualified researchers with a doctoral degree from a Swedish university the opportunity to expand their networks and their competences by working abroad under secure employment conditions. The grant is also intended to promote the quality and renewal of Swedish research.



Grant period, costs and grant funding


- 18-36 months (full time)
- At least 2/3 of the time must be spent abroad
- The amount is a standard amount




* research expenses relating to your stay and the research you will be carrying out (such as consumables, travel including stays at research facilities, and publication costs)

Time to decision 10-14 weeks.

Review panels

The Swedish Research Council's review panels assess and prioritise around 6 000 applications each year based on scientific quality and the merits of the applicant. The panels consist of around 900 active researchers with expertise in different areas.



- At least 3 reviewers per application
- External reviewers
- Grading & ranking


Sifting

 Applications with the lowest grades are not discussed at the meeting Panel meeting

 All remaining applications are discussed, jointly graded and ranked by the panel

Assessment Criteria



Overall grade

Guiding questions

Varies between panels (MH/HSES/NE)

Found in the end of the call text:

- How your applipcation is assessed

Example

Scientific quality of the proposed research (1-7)

An assessment of the quality of the project's research question and methodology, including its potential for future research.

Guiding questions:

- Are the addressed scientific questions important in the context of existing scientific knowledge and ongoing research worldwide?
- Does the proposal outline a research approach that permits the raised questions to be answered?
- When applicable, is the proposed development of methods or techniques of high scientific significance? Does the proposed development allow new scientific questions to be addressed?
- When applicable, how are issues relating to sex and gender perspectives justified and handled in the research plan?



Corona pandemic

You should **not** take the current pandemic situation into account in your application.

- 1. Postpone start / Pause project
- 2. Change host
- 3. Change of project plan

The aim should always be that 2/3 of the time is spent at the host university abroad.





Advice

- Aquaint yourself with prisma
 - read support and FAQ
- 2. Plan ahead and start in good time
- 3. Carefully read instructions and call text, submit all information requested

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

1. Create an account in Prisma

Start by creating a personal account in our application system Prisma and input your personal and CV data. You do not need to input any publications in your account – they should be appended in a PDF file when you fill in the application.

Prisma is the joint application system for the Swedish Research Council, Formas and Forte, which means that you can manage applications to all three research councils via a single account.

You only need to input the data once, and can thereafter supplement or change them as required. The persons assessing applications do not have access to the information in your account – when you fill in an application, you yourself upload the data needed for the grant you are applying for. Advices

4. Carefully consider costs and time abroad and raise questions with your employer

"The Swedish Research Council assumes that the administrating organisation, as the employer responsible, will cover any costs in excess of the standard amount."

5. If you receive a grant you need to be hired by the administrating organisation in Sweden
